## Trove Funding Petition – closes 22 February

No doubt you have heard of the uncertainty of future funding for Trove.

We encourage all History Queensland member groups (and their individual members) to click on this official Parliamentary Petition link to add their voice to the request for continued funding - <https://www.aph.gov.au/e-petitions/petition/EN4745>. Please forward the petition link to your members, and suggest they forward it to other people who may be interested in registering their protest.

Click the '*sign this petition box*' (blue box at the end of the page). After adding your details click '*Add my signature*'. It will take you less than thirty seconds to complete and you will receive an email from Parliament House to confirm your signature. Once you click the confirmation in that email, your signature is added to the petition.

Please note the **closing date for signatures is 22 Feb**, so there is urgency in letting the Government know your feelings.

# The Historical Foundations of History Queensland

## FOUNDATIONS

The first edition of *QALFHS News* – the forerunner of today's *HQ News* – announced support for the formation of a Queensland association which would unite kindred societies statewide, but not interfere with their independence.

The following is taken from the lead article published in April 1996 – and posted by snail mail – to proposed member societies.

### **“STRONG SUPPORT FOR QUEENSLAND ASSOCIATION**

More than forty representatives of Queensland history societies meeting at Ipswich Genealogical Society rooms on 24 February 1996 enthusiastically backed moves for a Queensland association....

The meeting adopted the name ***Queensland Association of Local and Family History Societies***, set membership fees for 1996/97 and discussed a draft constitution....

Formation of a Queensland association was also welcomed by Ms Helen Gregory, Community Historian in the Department of Environment and Heritage, who told the meeting that such an association would help to improve communication between history societies and her Department.

Meeting convenor and steering committee president, Heather Wort, said that early support from metropolitan and country societies was very encouraging. ‘History societies, wherever they are in Queensland, will have greater success in getting a better deal from government agencies and politicians if the societies’ major concerns are advocated by their state body in a strong, united and consistent way’, she said.

Mrs Wort said that while some local and family history societies have been well supported by their local council, others have received little or no support, forcing them to contend with unsuitable premises or pay exorbitant rents....

‘These unsatisfactory situations must be turned around, which is why the Queensland association will be advocating that history societies receive more recognition and support.’ Mrs Wort said that the Queensland association also would:

- Promote greater awareness of local and family history societies’ work in researching and recording important aspects of Queensland’s history and heritage;
- Act as a co-ordinating agency for major events such as conferences and history fairs;
- Print regular newsletters to keep member societies up-to-date on important events, new sources of information, relevant articles and book reviews;
- Promote fellowship, goodwill and co-operation between all Queensland societies.

‘We have adopted some high ideals and a practical management system but what we need most of all is for societies throughout Queensland to join us so that we have the unity and strength to advance our common interests,’ Mrs Wort said.”

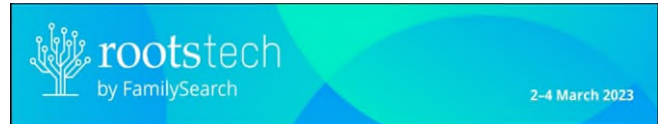
